From the Jurisprudence Committee:

To the voting members of Grand Court:

This article states the process to submit an amendment to the Bylaws of Grand Court. As the deadline for submission is fast approaching, as Chairman of the Jurisprudence Committee I am giving you this information so each amendment that is submitted will be considered at Grand Court as they are in proper format. Sorry that this is a fairly long article but information is knowledge.

## From Washington Grand Court Bylaws:

ARTICLE VI AMENDMENTS Section 51.

These Bylaws shall not be revised nor amended except at an Annual Session of Grand Court. Previous notice of such revisions or amendments shall be mailed to every Court at least sixty (60) days prior to the Annual Session of Grand Court. Such amendments, signed by the proposer, shall be submitted in writing to the Grand Secretary. Proposed revisions or amendments to be received by the Grand Secretary, not later than November 1st. Voting members not receiving a copy of the proposed amendments prior to Grand Court, shall receive a copy at Grand Court, and shall consider this due notice and not prevent action of the proposed amendments by reason of late notice. A majority vote of the members present and voting shall be necessary to adopt any such revision or amendments. All proposed amendments received by the Grand Secretary and distributed to the members of Grand Court, shall belong to the members of Grand Court and cannot be withdrawn except by approval of a majority vote of the members present and voting at Grand Court. These Bylaws shall not be suspended, but may be amended at any Annual Session of the Grand Court by majority vote of all members present and voting at Grand Court. Grand Court Bylaws Amendments shall be formatted as prescribed in the Supreme Constitution Part III Section 11 BYLAWS Paragraph (B5) Lines(1), (2) and (3) page 60.

#### Section 52.

In the event that the Supreme Council Committee on Grand Court Bylaws shall determine any provision in any amendment to these By-Laws to be in conflict with any provision contained in the Supreme Council Constitution, Rules and Regulations relative to Grand Courts or Subordinate Courts under their jurisdiction, and shall require that such conflict be removed as a condition precedent to the approval thereof, the Jurisprudence Committee of this Grand Court shall have authority to remove such conflict.

The above paragraphs are on pages 64 and 64A. It refers to pages in The Supreme Constitution on page 60 upon research the reference is no longer correct.

The Amendment portion (Section 11) is on page 76. The referenced section is on page 77 Subparagraph (C)

## From Supreme Constitution:

Section 11 BYLAWS

- (C) Any new Bylaw changes or amendments shall include the following:
  - 1. Name of Section (Example, Sec. 28, Standing Committees and Their Duties I page\_\_\_).
- 2. Submit the Bylaw as it currently stands with the notation Now Reads: or Delete in its Entirety, if applicable.
- 3. Submit the new or amended Bylaw as corrected with an asterisk at the beginning and one at the end of where the changes were made as approved by the Grand Court Session. This paragraph should begin with Change to read or Replace With.

**Below is an example** of an Amendment that was submitted to Supreme Council—This is the format to submit an amendment to the Grand Secretary.

Part II REGULATIONS FOR SUPREME COUNCIL SEC. 10 (G) ELECTIVE OFFICERS

**Currently reads**: (G) Each Supreme Elected Officer must keep the Supreme Royal Matron and the Supreme Secretary informed of their current home address and telephone number.

**Action**: After home change to read words "address, telephone number, email address, and cell phone number (if they have one)."

**Will then read**: (G) Each Supreme Elected Officer must keep the Supreme Royal Matron and the Supreme Secretary informed of their current home \*address, telephone number, email address, and cell phone number (if they have one).\*

**Rationale**: Electronic communication is now a legally accepted practice.

If you are a voting member of Grand Court and you wish to submit a change to the Grand Court Bylaws, the change in the proper format must be on the Grand Secretary's desk by November 1<sup>st</sup>. (not postmarked—but on her desk) It must be the original with original signatures. For the ease of preparation for the Grand Court Packet, H.L. Linda would appreciate an electronic copy of the amendment on Nov. 1<sup>st</sup> or shortly thereafter. If you have any questions about what or how to submit your amendment, please contact the Jurisprudence Committee so your amendment will be in proper form to be considered at Grand Court.
